## FR GERWYN LEAVES TO BECOME ARCHDEACON OF MONTGOMERY

Having become in a very short time part of the life of Thaxted and the villages, Fr. Gerwyn has been "poached" to go back to Wales to become Archdeacon of Montgomery.

Fr. Gerwyn was born on the 9th of April 1965 and educated at Liverpool Polytechnic and St Stephen's House, Oxford and ordained in 2004.

Before ordination Gerwyn worked in the field of property development, a background that was recognised when he worked in the Church of England as an advisor for the Church Urban Fund and Liverpool's Diocesan Advisory Committee.

After a curacy at Saint Mary's Church, West Derby, Liverpool, he was Chaplain to the Archbishop of Wales from 2007 to 2009. He was priest in charge of Holy Trinity Bolton-le-Sands from 2009 to 2012 and again Archbishop's Chaplin from 2012 until his appointment as Dean of Llandaff Cathedral, where he was installed on the 28th of February 2014, holding that post until 2022.

On the 31st of January 1923, he was installed as the Rector of our Benefice of Thaxted, the Sampfords, Radwinter and

Hempstead by the Bishop Chelmsford, the Right Reverend Dr Guli Francis-Dehgani. The special service was held in Thaxted Parish Church and featured music from the Sampford Singers and the Thaxted Church Choir. Members οf the congregation of all the churches in the Benefice attended this service to welcome their new Priest.

During his all-too-short time with us, he has endeared himself to the local people with his Anglo-Catholic ways, his prayerful approach to all the services, his sense of fun and his explanatory sermons. These sermons became a hallmark of his ministry explaining not just the words of the Gospel but the text into which they fitted.

The search to find Fr Gerwyn was long and difficult and now the benefits is to start the process all over again. As Thaxted Churchwardens Paul Meader and Colin Harrison said, "The Bishop of Saint Asaph is not our favourite person right now"! However, all the PCC members and clergy across the benefice wish him well in his new post and said goodbye to him on August the 18th with a celebration of his ministry in Thaxted Church after Mass.

#### Dear residents,

Welcome to the Harvest edition of our magazine and I'd like to begin by passing on some excellent news! You might remember in our last edition, I set out Thaxted's response to the emerging Uttlesford New Local Plan (Regulation 18) in which we described why c.500 houses in our town would be unsustainable. Our response was received very well by the District Council and by utilising 'The Power of One' speaking with One Voice, taking considerations and responses in consultation through an informal alliance of views which produced our One Voice submission. Political voices; District, County and Parish, combined with the Thaxted Society, ECO Thaxted, HOT and others all combined to suggest a single and professional One Voice.

The content of the revised and now adopted Local Plan (Regulation 19) is now hugely more favourable for Thaxted with no new housing proposed outside of that which has already been granted permission. Everything that helped make the changes is due to this **One Voice** and the hard research and professionalism which underpinned it.

#### Thaxted - NEWS - Society

#### WHOSE TRAFFIC IS IT ANYWAY...

A visitor to Thaxted in the 1950's and sixties could not have missed the thunder of traffic through Thaxted on the A130 now the B184. Before the opening of the M11 and as the combustion engine took the place of the horse and cart, traffic at Thaxted was both heavy and more important, seriously polluting. And there was an awful lot of it, thundering between Chelmsford and Cambridge.

The B184 is now considerably longer than it was originally by dint of its having taken

over a sizeable chunk of the A130. Leaving Saffron Walden, the B184 continues across Essex countryside through Thaxted, and on to the edge of Great Dunmow.

Whilst the pollution has been reduced

over the years, the tranquillity brought by the opening of the motorway, M11, was short lived as satnavs suggested that the route through Thaxted was both quicker and cheaper for heavy freight.

So, even for traffic, there is little new under the sun and, whilst the Society has firm policy about the scourge of pavement parking, we have never had a broader policy concerning traffic and its effect on the conservation area and Thaxted wellbeing. Whether it was better or worse once should not affect the fundamental arguments for health and wellbeing.

To this end we intend to commission a study of both the history of the B184, in all its iterations, and a contemporary traffic study so that your Society may add to the discussion based upon facts and research. It is important to note that changes to road's designation can be yet another example of the political football, in that the A roads are the responsibility of Highways while B roads fall to the County Council. Thus, we must rely on ECC for any resolution.

At the end of the day we all contribute to traffic and what we dislike about it is the price we pay for driving convenience. We should not forget that as in all things, our own driving should reflect how we would wish others to drive. Traffic is us! The good and the bad.

#### UTTLESFORD LOCAL PLAN

Harvest comes in many forms but for the Society this autumn is bountiful. The new proposed Local Plan for Uttlesford brings with it varied good news for Thaxted. Inevitably that good news, whilst welcome, may herald changes down the line and your Society will always remain vigilant in recognising that silver linings may have tarnished futures. #### WHAT SHOPS SAY

Recently someone asked for details of the location of this shop.

It was of course the Bull Ring, once known as Pardoner's Place, but this shop and its contents tell us more by its disappearance than the picture alone. What this shop sold and the services it provided would be unthinkable, in the Thaxted of today,



especially since, there were other such shops. What it sold was both useful, and necessary. Hats, gloves, dresses, shoes, and all sorts of household goods. Round this time six pubs remained along with two butchers, two bakers, and even a cobbler.

This list is not exhaustive but what it illustrates is that there was a time when Thaxted was entirely self-reliant. No need to take the stagecoach, or indeed the intermittent train. Until we all had cars, Thaxted was indeed home and all you could want. That change, along with online shopping and delivery, has altered our lives and by affect Thaxted. It is important to recognise these changes in order to understand the future for our 'home.'

#### THAXTED HISTORY PROJECT

Later in the year we will be publishing the 3rd volume of the THP. This is a long-term endeavour, to research and publish the important and contributory events in Thaxted's growth and History. In the third in the series, Richard Till, considers the rather tumultuous years of Thaxted as Borough and then not a Borough.

A time when it was considered acceptable to plunder Yardley's Charity to balance the council's accounts or attempt to interfere in the function of the Church. What we might today consider wayward political shenanigans pale into insignificance compared with the fractious and near nefarious goings on in the mid 1500's. The launch of this volume, with the author signing copies, will take place in Thaxted Library later in the year.

## SUMMER IN THAXTED DURING THE 1960S

Growing up in Thaxted in the 60's there was always plenty going on for us kids and families, we spent most of our time out and about over the fields, weather allowing. As summer approached Whit Monday was the fete on the vicarage lawn, the vicarage in those days was up Newbiggen Street and was subsequently developed as was the lovely garden into a total of over a dozen properties!

There were side shows like Mark Arman making his pottery, Hugh Coe manager of the Co-op ran a



bowling for pig stall, Mark Caton had a wooden aeroplane that he spun round and you won whatever the tail stopped over, he'd always call us children over to have a go.

The Morris danced and there was country dancing for all to participate in. The garden lent itself well for such an event as it had done since the first revival dancing in 1911. Fr. Jack did so much for the town including taking youngsters on walking holidays all over the place.

The other good garden was at Aldboro House, home of Michael Weller and his wife Daphne, they hosted the British Legion Fête on August Holiday Monday, this was always a good event. As they had a pond a stout log was placed over it and two people would sit astride it and attempt to knock each other off with sacks full of straw into the pond, there were always plenty of volunteers! Also lots of stalls and refreshments, with the derelict Windmill as a backdrop on the hill behind.

We always enjoyed watching the Morris dancing on Bank Holidays as

today, only it took place in the road at the Bull Ring not in the church vard as there was far less Any traffic was ably traffic. controlled by the towns two special constables David Kinley and Mr Percival who lived up Newbiggen and drank in the Bull public bar with George Rolph, Percy Coe, Mark Caton and all the other old boys that frequented those premises. He had come from London and always wore a bow tie when not in uniform, it is not printable what he called us children when my father would tell us to ask him the time! You'd be lucky there wouldn't be more than half a dozen cars pass through. We could ride down past the Beech tree and the Cock Inn on soap box carts safely in those days.

The Patronal Festival was also a popular event, we would follow the dancing through the town before bedtime and for us church servers the Sunday procession was one of the years largest and went from the Vicarage to the west door of the church and filled the road, the church would be full to celebrate the life of Saint John the Baptist.

But the main event for me was always Morris Weekend as it was quite a spectacle in those days as it is today, enjoyed by many locals as people didn't travel in the same way as today. Excitement would mount during the week before and when the board went up in front of the Church Hall to list the visiting sides and the arrangements for the weekend, we knew it wasn't far away.

We lived on the corner of Margaret Street and Vicarage Lane. In those days many of the dancers camped on the piece of land at the end of the old vicarage lawn so would be up and down by our house all weekend. We would anxiously wait to hear the first bells of the visiting sides as they walked up the lane to pitch their tents at the Vicarage as they quite often came in their kit on Friday afternoon.

Also across the lane from us were the old public toilets which the dancers camping would use for their ablutions over the weekend often using the ladies side as well. Men would often join up for a dance whilst waiting, I used to sit on the front doorstep to watch and listen to the lovely old tunes passed down over the years. All weekend the town seemed to come alive with music and dance at any time as well as the planned events.

The Bull was the main pub for the Morris and had an extension on the Friday night as pubs shut at 10.30 pm then, it was always the place to go to hear fine folk

singing, music and dancing in the yard. I was too young to go in but would go and watch and listen with my father until it was past my bedtime. Needless to say the merriment continued as long possible that evening.

Saturday morning the men went off for their tours around the local villages and some to Saffron Walden, some men would dance in Thaxted mid-afternoon and we would sit under the Guildhall to watch.

Thaxted was much quieter in those days, a lot more shops but less traffic so it wasn't thought necessary to close the road as it is today. As the day wore on and afternoon was turning to evening the dancers all back from their

tours gathered around to process to the Guildhall as today to the tune called Winster Processional. We would walk down the pavement so we saw all the procession and be at the Guildhall as it arrived, a mass of colour and music with Fools and Horses to entertain us kids. Long serving Thaxted Fool Cliff Yeldham always recognised the local children and hit us with his pigs bladder on a bit of string, it was quite a spectacle for us all.

As I got older, I was allowed to stay out longer so I could see more of the evening. One year my father said he'd take me down to see the second half of the evening and the Abbotts Bromley horn dance that concluded the



evening, I was so excited. When the time arrived we stood by the corner of the Guildhall and the street fell silent As we strained our ears to hear the sound of the fiddle, usually played by Russell Caton, playing the lovely old tune for this dance becoming louder as it grew closer, the men appearing carrying the antlers that remember used to scare me when they were kept in the entrance hall at the old Vicarage and we went there for Sunday School some weeks. The dance seemed to last forever as they twisted and turned and came together to that haunting tune in the shadows of the old Guildhall, a setting for so much of Thaxted history. Then they headed off back up Stoney Lane and the music faded away until we could hear it no more, there was always a moment of silence followed by applause. have seen it many times since but never forget the lasting impact the first time had on me. And so to be contented.

Being a server in church meant that I took part in the procession to church for the Sunday service. All the dancers took part and a chosen side would dance the Offertory dance in The Crossing as part of the service. Another fine spectacle of colour and music, dancers in their kit, all the church people in robes and candles and banners being carried aloft with

incense being swung in a thurible as we made our way to the west door of the church. The music played by the musicians of the visiting sides. The "Fieldtown Processional" changing to "Monks March" on entering the church. It was lovely to hear and made us all feel part of the weekend.

When we came out of church there was more dancing in the Bull Ring and country dancing which the public were encouraged to The afternoon take part in. country dance session was on the vicarage lawn, a lovely setting for such an event and was well supported by Morris Men and public alike, again us kids would go and watch and listen to the music. At about 4pm it all came to an end for another year, the events of the weekend would be subject of many a pub evening that summer.

After we got home from the vicarage, we would hear the bells of the men heading home as they came down the lane. I have often likened the whole weekend to the Abbotts Bromley, it starts quietly and builds up as it goes and reaches its peak then slowly fades to silence as it ends as all depart.

It still happens today I am glad to say and I do hope it has a similar lasting effect on people as it had on me as did all the childhood Thaxted events.

#### SERVANT LEADERSHIP

A story is told about King Hussein of Jordan facing up to a potential coup. A group of his generals were planning to assassinate him and set up a replacement government. According to the story (which is not proven) when he heard about the intention of his generals, he did something unusual and downright dangerous. Rather than sending in the army and having them immediately arrested he flew down to the airbase where the generals were based. Striding into the room he bared his chest and said, "Here I am. Shoot me if you will." Overcome by this action the generals ended their opposition then and there and pledged their loyalty.

As I reflected on this story I pondered on the nature of leadership. Britain has just come to the end of another general election. The country has a new government. One that has pledged to fulfil its promises to the people, but which faces massive challenges across a whole range of areas. People across the country are hungry for leadership that will put the people first. As I thought about that I was reminded of the words of Tony Blair in 1997,

"What the people give, the people can take away. We are the servants. They are the masters now. To govern Britain is a privilege not a right. Never forget it."

Jesus put it another way in Matthew 20:27-28

"Whoever wants to be a leader among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first among you must become your slave. For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve others and to give his life as a ransom for many."

In other words true leadership is not about power, but humility. True leaders do not care about self-aggrandisement or power. They care about the people they lead. They seek to give people what they need, which is not always the same as what they want. True leaders are courageous and honest. Integrity governs everything they do. They are in it for the long haul. They lead by word and example. We are not all in positions of public leadership, but we may lead offices, clubs, churches, or families. The same principle applies.

Finally it is worth pointing out one small difference between Jesus and King Hussein. King Hussein walked away alive from his encounter. Jesus did not. As it says in the verse above, he gave his life as a ransom for many. Like those generals many people have no time for God in their lives. They want to get rid of him. Yet in response God did something not just risky, but incredibly sacrificial. He sent his Son to lose his life so that we could have real life. A life lived in fellowship with God. A life lived for eternity for those who want it.

Since the event, Lowe's on Town St, have reported an increase in sales of insulation materials and LED bulbs!





#### Windmill Update

Over the past two years the Trustees of the Windmill, Volunteers, and a large team of specialists have been working very hard throughout the Development Phase of the Project. This has allowed the piloting of several schemes in the community, fundraising and a thorough investigation of the building including up to date costings for a full restoration.

By the time that you read this article, the funding applications to the National Lottery Heritage Fund and Historic England will have been submitted and shall be pending an outcome. The Trustees hope to hear around December time as to whether they have been successful and can move forward with the project.

If the Trust is fortunate to receive the funding, work at the Windmill is scheduled to commence around March 2025 and will run for a period of around 18 - 24 months, the building reopening to the public sometime in 2027. Besides a fully refurbished and working Windmill there will be a brand new Museum housed within incorporating up to date displays and technology for an enhanced visitor experience.

Our Project Team have been amazing and have all gone above and beyond and demonstrating a passion and belief in what the Trust is trying to achieve. #### NEWS FROMTHAXTED SURGERY

Jessica Peck - Practice Manager

We continue to be very busy here at the surgery. Demand for appointments is not lessening; more and more work is being pushed back into Primary Care from Secondary Care (hospitals) and, sadly for us, bureaucracy increases every day.

However, saying that we are lucky to have a strong team who continue to help and care for patients the best they can - I am very grateful to them all! We welcomed some new reception and dispensary team members in the last six months, and they have proved to be great additions to our team, bringing with experience them and enthusiasm.

#### DISPENSARY

We took the decision earlier this year to increase our dispensary turnaround time from 48 hours to 72 hours. This is not a decision we reached lightly but due workload. increased patient safety and the increasing stock shortages we felt it was a logical one. Please do remember that this is 3 full working days, not including weekends or Bank Holidays. Prescription charges

also went up in May this year from £9.65 p/item to £9/90 p/item.

#### **APPOINTMENTS**

As mentioned previously demand for appointments runs very high however, I am sad to sav that our DNA (Did not attend) rate is also increasing - particularly amongst appointments that are pre booked in advance. We do understand that sometimes there are circumstances beyond vour control but where possible we ask that you notify the surgery if you unable attend to appointment or no longer need an appointment - that way we can release it and offer it to someone else.

#### GP REGISTRAR

Something new for us - we will be welcoming our first GP Registrar to the surgery from August. Dr Jonathan Saye will be joining the team here for six months. GP Registrars are qualified doctors



undergoing specific extra training to become a GP in the future. Appointments with him will become available from September after his induction period.

#### PPG (PATIENT PARTICIPATION GROUP)

We are very fortunate to have a supportive PPG here at Thaxted and are very grateful for the £2000 raised by them over the past year, including the Christmas Raffle. We have put this money towards some new equipment such as blood pressure monitors, a new vaccine fridge and other equipment. The PPG are always on the look out for new members

so if you think you may be interested please enquire at reception and we can point you in their direction.

#### VACCINE CLINICS

Last but not least, we are approaching flu and covid time again. We will be offering vaccine clinics at Lord Butler Leisure Centre from the first weekend in October. There will also be one clinic in house. Eligible patients will receive an invite. Please can I urge you to support your local surgery and attend either the in house one or the at the leisure centre.

### CAVE, REFECTORY, ROAD

### Revd Mark Hayes

As we explore what it means to be "Church" in today's society, Thaxted United Reformed Church has been using three themes from lan Adams' book "Cave, Refectory, Road." †

lan Adams identifies monastic rhythms for contemporary living:

The Cave can be seen in Jesus' going into the desert to pray. It is a place of stillness and withdrawal.

The **Refectory** builds on the monastic practice of hospitality, reflecting Jesus' commitment to synagogue and temple as places of learning, and his inclusive sharing at table.

The **Road** is Jesus' practice of connection and community-echoed in the travelling band of teachers and followers that have been an important feature of Christianity down the ages.

These rhythms can be followed by all of us as we seek to put our faith into practice.

For us, the **Cave** is a place for reflection, both as individuals and together in fellowship. At home it might be a favourite armchair in which we sit while we reflect and pray. At church we have been nurturing a 'wild garden' with the aim of creating both a positive

environment for wildlife and a quiet place for contemplation and reflection. This summer's weather has not helped the process, but the Messy Church Summer Holiday Club successfully used parts of the garden during one of its sessions.

Our **Refectory** is our church building which is a place for both physical and spiritual refreshment. We share in the Lord's supper and meals together. As well as worshipping together, we explore 'The Story' through our occasional informal Sunday afternoon services. combining both spiritual and physical sustenance each month at Breakfast Church.

We follow our **Road** through outward facing activities that seek to engage with the wider community in Thaxted. Working in partnership with other Thaxted churches, we host family friendly *Messy Church* every month and our *Second Saturday Coffee Mornings* provide an opportunity to share tea, coffee and chat. We also play an active role with Churches Together in Thaxted and support TWAM (Tools with a Mission) and Christian Aid.

For all of us, these monastic rhythms can help us develop community and make a difference personally, locally, and in the wider world.

### ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS AT THAXTED UNITED REFORMED CHURCH, BOLFORD STREET

**Sundays:** We usually meet for Morning Worship on Sundays at 9.30am, sharing coffee after the service. On the first Sunday of the month our service includes Communion.

**Breakfast Church:** On the second Sunday each month, "Breakfast Church" at 9.30am starts with a light breakfast of bacon rolls, *croissants* and *pains au chocolat*, followed by an informal, family friendly service. This service is especially suitable for families with children. Everybody welcome! Breakfast Church will meet at 9.30am on Sundays 8th September 13th October and 8th December.

The Story: Most months we also meet for an informal service at 3pm exploring "the Story" focusing on each book of the Bible. The services are followed by light refreshments and an opportunity for discussion. "The Story" will continue at 3pm on Sundays 6th October 10th November and 8th December.

**Messy Church:** This meets monthly, usually on the second Tuesday, from 4.00pm to 5.30pm and is probably best described as "Church, but not as you know it"! Ideal for families, we have fun exploring stories through craft, songs and sharing tea together. Messy Church meets again at 4pm on Tuesdays 17th September, 8th October, 12th November and 10th December.

**Second Saturday Coffee Mornings:** We meet for tea, coffee, cake and chat on the second Saturday each month from 10.00am to 12.30. Everybody welcome and we have activities available for children. The next Second Saturday Coffee Mornings will be on 14th September, 12th October, 9th November and 14th December.

**Our Garden:** We are working on a "wild garden" at the rear of our church: a space to sit, reflect and also provide a home for birds, insects and other wildlife. If you'd like to get involved in this project, please get in touch.

### THAXTED'S FOOTPATHS

Thaxted has a wealth of Public Rights of Way, many radiating out from the centre of the Town and with interconnecting paths enabling circular walks out into our countryside.

If you are not completely sure of the routes there are a couple of walk booklets available from the CIC in Town Street and there is a large scale map in the Margaret Street car park. The P3 group also arrange guided walks on some Bank Holidays throughout the year

These paths are looked after by a team of volunteers, financed and administered by a partnership between our Parish Council and Essex Highways (the Parish Pathways Partnership or P3), and of course some

landowners also carry out an annual cut of the paths that run through their land.

The P3 group mow the paths, cut back brambles and nettles, and remove fallen trees, and in a typical year the volunteers collectively put in over 325 hours of activity and mow many miles of paths. Last year we used over 80 litres of fuel in our mowers.

In the last twelve months bridges have been replaced on the paths out towards Richmonds Farm and from the Sampford Road down towards the Solar Farm, and repairs carried out on a number of footbridges and steps.

### THAXTED SQUAD IN LAS VEGAS!!!



What is it and how can you help? The public consultation is coming and you are able to sign up to receive an alert when it is open.

More than ever, wildlife and their habitats are under threat for survival. The Essex Local Nature Recovery Strategy provides a new vision for our natural spaces and the draft strategy is currently being prepared for public consultation. Made mandatory in the Environment Act of 2021, the Essex Local Nature Recovery Strategy (LNRS) presents a pivotal opportunity for us all to contribute towards a sustainable future for our wildlife and the landscapes they inhabit. Essex County Council, in collaboration with the Essex Local Nature Partnership, has created the draft Essex LNRS, alongside a range of key local stakeholders, including Supporting Authorities, farmers, landowners, environmental organisations and charities, community groups, parish and town councils and the public.

Covering the whole of Greater Essex, the document aims to identify key locations for the creation and enhancement of habitats, focusing on areas that will provide the most significant benefits for nature and the wider environment. By outlining key biodiversity priorities and proposed actions, the aim is to achieve a more connected, collaborative approach to nature recovery. The draft strategy is expected to go to public consultation later this summer.


